



Frequently Asked Questions

Trenton Health Team Accountable Care Organization Project Opportunity

Question: Does the medicaid cohort have to be a defined group or can there could be a generic Trenton population group that would certainly include medicaid recipients?

Answer: The population served through the project can be a generic population as long as the group is comprised primarily of individuals who are Medicaid recipients AND the inclusion of non-Medicaid recipients doesn't increase the cost of the project (ie: Medicaid cannot pay for additional costs incurred by non-Medicaid recipients).

Question: Is a healthcare entity/organization eligible to apply for funding?

Answer: Yes, a healthcare organization/entity that is a 501c3 or a municipal entity is eligible. Funds may not used to pay for services otherwise reimbursable by Medicaid (ie: no double-dipping).

Question: If my Church has a food pantry in conjunction with a 501c3 Organization are we able to apply for funding?

Answer: As long as the applicant is a 501c3 non-profit or a municipal entity, the organization is able to apply.

Question: Can programs working to address the social determinants of health include after school and summer camps for students, mentoring and safe haven programs for children and food access programs like Send Hunger Packing?

Answer: This grant funds community health improvement projects addressing the areas of Chronic disease prevention or management (e.g., diabetes, hypertension, CAD, cancer), maternal and child health, substance use and behavioral health, social determinants of health (e.g., transportation, housing, food access, safety), clinical-community linkages, and access to primary and/or specialty care. Programs should have, and applications should demonstrate, clear linkages to health outcomes.
